Christian egalitarianism, also known as **biblical equality** or evangelical feminism, is egalitarianism based in Christianity. Christian egalitarians believe that the Bible mandates gender equality, which implies equal authority and responsibility for the family and the ability for women to exercise spiritual authority as clergy. In contrast to complementarianists and Christian patriarchists, proponents of egalitarianism argue that Bible verses cited to justify differentiation in gender roles are misunderstood. Egalitarians say they support mutual submission of all people to each other in relationships and human institutions as a form of respect without a hierarchy in authority.

Liberal feminism rejects the notion that creation established the patriarchy; and asserts that gender equality originally existed, but was distorted by historical injustices against women. This branch of egalitarianism dictates that gender equality must be restored rather than introduced. This restoration will be accomplished by economic, political, social, and systemic reformation including the church in her reform, displaying its participation in gender subordination.

Direct democracy or pure democracy is a form of democracy in which the electorate decides on policy initiatives without elected representatives as proxies. This differs from the majority of currently established democracies, which are representative democracies
