Compromise = settlement of a dispute that is reached by each side making concessions. accept standards that are lower than is desirable. To negotiate

A husband and wife can compromise on the color of paint for the living room.

Men...pick your battles. Don't die on a hill not worth having.

When its good to compromise = 2 equal but different opinions, an appeal to authority can help correct policy. A stubborn argument with the boss can get you fired!

Healthy compromise = Healthy compromise means when you reach an impasse and you are not sure how to get out of it, then both of you make adjustments to your behavior to resolve the impasse with mutual desires to make your relationship flow again. In contrast, unhealthy compromise is often one-sided.

<u>Unhealthy compromise</u> = go against your values, core beliefs, boundaries, or discount or invalidate your own feelings. Just remember that it is still okay and important to know when to say no.

Integrity = stay true to your values, core beliefs

Commitment = not wavering, bending, or watering down what's pure.

The "Castle Doctrine," and "Make My Day" or "Stand Your Ground" laws are all in force in Oklahoma, and these allow a person to defend himself or herself against

threats to personal safety. Acts of justifiable homicide are defined by Oklahoma's law (1983 movie with Clint E, "Dirty Harry" called sudden impact)

It was used by the Continental Marines as an early motto flag, Its design proclaims an assertive warning of vigilance and willingness to act in defense against coercion often used in the United States as a symbol for classical liberty, and small government; for distrust or defiance against authorities and government;

I was surprised by the following true story:

The location: Pearl Harbor The date: Sunday morning, December 7, 1941. Three hundred and fifty-three Japanese airplanes began swarming all around the harbor. Within a couple of hours, America lost eight battleships, six major airfields, almost all planes and 2,400 men. What began at 7:50 a.m. was supposedly a surprised attack. But these are the startling facts:

That morning, 50 minutes earlier, at 7 a.m., while the Japanese warplanes were 137 miles (50 minutes) away, two US soldiers on a small radar station in the Pacific scanned the screen and saw dots appearing, until the whole screen was filled. These soldiers notified their youthful supervisor, a lieutenant. No other officer was around, that being a Sunday.

The lieutenant thought these must be planes from California, and without another thought, said these crucial words: "Don't worry about it." There would have been time to scramble the planes at Pearl Harbor, prepare the battleships and shelter the men, but this lieutenant, at the most responsible moment of his career, failed the nation with the words, "Don't worry about it."

In our own lives, is there something that could wreak havoc—spiritual destruction in your life—and yet you dismiss it away, thinking, "Oh, don't worry about it! It's just a 'little' sin"? It is nothing big." That is what we call spiritual compromise. Pearl Harbor may have been prevented if someone took the warning seriously. But because they didn't, they said, "Don't worry about it," and thousands of lives were lost.

Tony Evans said:

"Compromise is the cancer of the church, and we must rid Christ's body of it. While Christians can compromise on preferences, they cannot compromise on principles. We can't be one way on Sunday and another on Monday. This is a major problem among Christians in America today. We don't take a stand. We don't keep our standards. We merely shift to satisfy society."
